ORDINANCE NO. 2011-5

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING, CHANGING AND MODIFYING THE MONROE TOWNSHIP TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE NO. 87-1, ARTICLE III, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 89-1, ARTICLE III, SECTION 5, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 95-1, ARTICLE III, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 96-6, ARTICLE III, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 96-15, ARTICLE III, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 98-3, ARTICLE III, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 2005-1, ARTICLE III, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 2007-1, ARTICLE III, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 2007-07, ARTICLE III, MONROE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 2011-1, SECTION 1 - MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS ESTABLISHED ON CERTAIN STREETS; ESTABLISHING AND CREATING A CERTAIN SPEED LIMIT, ALL IN MONROE TOWNSHIP.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Monroe Township has in the past enacted Ordinances regulating traffic and parking, specifically, establishing and creating speed limits; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Monroe Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, is desirous of establishing and creating certain stop signs and speed limits in Monroe Township; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance and the objections leading to its enactment are authorized by "The Second Class Township Code," Act of May 1, 1933, P.L. 103, No. 69, reenacted and amended November 6, 1996, P.L. 350, No. 60 (53 P.S. Section 65101, et seq.); and by the "Vehicle Code," Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, No. 81 (75 Pa.C.S.A. 101 et seq.) as amended; it is therefore enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Monroe Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1: AMENDMENT

Article III, of the Monroe Township Traffic Regulation Ordinance, Ordinance No. 87-1, as amended and modified by Ordinance No. 89-1, Section 3, Ordinance No. 95-1, Section 1, Ordinance No. 96-6, Section 5, Ordinance No. 96-15, Ordinance No. 98-3, Section 5, Ordinance No. 2005-1, Section 1, Ordinance No. 2007-1, Section 2, Ordinance No. 2007-07, Section 1, Ordinance No. 2011-1, Section 1, shall be amended and modified by adding thereto the following:

SECTION 5: MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS ESTABLISHED ON CERTAIN STREETS

(a) Maximum speed limits are established on portions of specified streets, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle, on any part of a street where a maximum speed limit applies, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the street:

<u>Highway</u>	<u>Between</u>	<u>Maximum Speed Limit</u>
1. Kuhn Road (T-651)	Between the intersection of Creek Road (T-650) and the intersection of Maxele Lane (T-703).	35MPH

(b) Any person violating this section is guilty of a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) and costs. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five (5) miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each mile in excess of five (5) miles per hour over the maximum speed limit. The fines and costs imposed herein are subject to modification. The fines and costs will be the maximum fines and costs allowed under applicable provisions of the "Vehicle Code," Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, No. 81 (75 Pa.C.S.A. 101 et seq.), then in effect.

SECTION 2: CONTINUATION

The provisions of this Ordinance, so far as they are the same as those of Ordinances in force immediately prior to the enactment of this Ordinance, are intended as a continuation of such Ordinances and not as new enactments. Provisions of this Ordinance shall not affect any act done or liability incurred, nor shall they affect any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted to enforce any right or penalty or to punish any offense under the authority of any Ordinance repealed by this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective in accordance with law.

SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY

In the event that any provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair any remaining provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance or other Ordinances affected by this Ordinance, it being the intent of Monroe Township that such remainder shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: RELATIONSHIP TO OTHER ORDINANCES

All other Ordinances, parts of Ordinances or parts of Resolutions inconsistent herewith shall be and the same expressly are repealed.
