REMINDERS

- Open burning/ fires are prohibited in the Conservation Zone (the mountain area near and including White Rock Acres).
- Cleaning and maintenance of driveway pipes is the responsibility of the homeowner.
- Please refrain from placing or planting items within the road right-of-way area. Items in the right-of-way area can affect sight distances, snow removal and other road work. The public works department reserves the right to trim or remove any items within the right-of-way.
- Pets should NOT be allowed to roam freely in any neighborhood or onto any neighbor's properties; or otherwise be allowed to disturb neighbors.
- Please report any downed roadway signs to the Township office.
- Dirt bikes & ATV's are not permitted on public roadways, including cul-de-sacs, in the township.
- Speed limits are established for the safety of all, please obey the posted speeds and stop signs in all areas of the township.

Burning Permit Note: Monroe Township may issue a Permit which gives a Monroe Property Owner the authorization to conduct an open burn on cut trees, stumps and brush. This permit does not allow the burning of such items as demolition waste, insulation, shingles, treated wood, paint, painted or stained objects or furniture, tires, mattresses, box springs, metal, insulating coating on wire, television sets and appliances, automobiles, automotive parts, batteries, PVC products, waste oil and other petroleum products.

The Monroe Fire Marshall should be contacted at 717-258-6642 or 717-697-4613 option 5 of the auto attendant, if you have any questions as to allowable materials under the open burn permit.

If you are mailing your tax payment close to the end of the payment period, please be aware that payment must be received in this office by the payment period end date, or USPS postmarked by the payment period end date to qualify for that payment option.

Counter service at any USPS branch will handstamp the postmark on request, to provide proof of mailing date.

Mt. Zion Cemetery: Our Community Cemetery

Located at the intersection of Boiling Springs Road and York Road, Mt. Zion Cemetery serves all of Monroe Township. This historic cemetery dates back to the early 1800's and counts among its approximately 5000 residents several Civil War veterans, some who were killed in action. There are over 500 veterans buried here from most of the wars in which the United States has fought.

This 16 acre cemetery is run by a volunteer board of directors, drawn from those community members interested in history, preserving the past, and treating those buried here with respect. We are always looking for like-minded people to join us.




Winter Weather Reminders

2023. It is our pleasure to serve the citizens of Monroe Township and surrounding communities. In 2023, we spent over 1,100 hours training, in addition to responding to calls for service (numbers below are as of December 1, 2023):

77 Structure Fires, 3 Vehicle Fires, 39 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 22 Gas Leaks, 24 Automatic Fire Alarms, 24 Outside Fires (including wildland fires), 4 Rescues, 13 Wires Down, 37 Service Calls, 80 Medical Assist calls and 17 Standby/ Transfers.

We enjoyed seeing you at our 2023 events: Easter Bunny, National Night Out, Pit Beef Sales, Toast with Representative Thomas Kutz, Santa (with Frosty and Rudolph), and other appearances. Thanks to Rep. Thomas Kutz's help securing a grant, we were able to replace our expired breathing apparatus (air packs). Due to Rep. Kutz's timely assistance, we can safely continue providing lifesaving services.


No yoga experience is needed.

rabbittransit Shared Ride Travel Tips

Cooler weather season is here, so how do you plan to travel and beat the chill? Whether you want

to run errands, attend medical appointments, join recreational activities, or visit friends, there's an easy (and warm!) way to get there: Book a Shared Ride with rabbittransit.

Unlike a scheduled bus route that only operates in one area, Shared Ride (a.k.a. Paratransit) provides consolidated trips between travel origins and destinations during limited hours and specific areas.

All Shared Ride trips require a reservation. If you would like same-day service, you must make your reservation by 1:30 p.m. Otherwise, reservations must be made no later than 12:00 p.m. the business day before your ride. Reservations may be made two weeks in advance. For trips on Saturday, Sunday or Monday, reservations must be submitted by 12 p.m. the Friday before. Visit www.rabbittransit.org > Shared Ride > Reservations to schedule a reservation.

Here are some other tips for traveling with rabbittransit in cold or inclement weather conditions:

- Plan Ahead: Extreme winter weather may cause delays in Shared Ride service, so please plan ahead and allow extra time for travel. This is especially important if you're making a new trip or one you are not completely familiar with. While ride times may vary, Shared Ride is a reliable and safe transportation option that can give you peace of mind when accessing life-sustaining services. If you need to update or cancel a trip, use the FindMyRide website, or call our Customer Service Center at 1-800-632-9063.
- Dress Warmly: Remember to dress for winter conditions. Cold air may enter the vehicles during the loading and unloading process, especially on windy days.
- Step Carefully: Bus floors and steps may become slippery from snow & ice. Kick the snow from your shoes before stepping on board. Use the handrails and take your time.
- Stay Informed: In case of inclement weather, rabbittransit may have delays. Sign up for rider alerts and receive an email, text message or phone call about unexpected service changes.

If Shared Ride sounds like a fit for you, the first step is to submit an application to the program you'd like to participate in. Shared Ride programs vary from Senior Shared Ride to the Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP), ADA Complementary Paratransit Program (ADA), or Paratransit Full Fare. Illicit Discharges are any direct or indirect non-stormwater discharges to the storm sewer systems or streams.

There are many things that do not belong in our storm drains and streams, such as oil (cooking or motor), grease, grass clippings, leaves, paint, chemicals, and solvents.
