#### \*\*REMINDERS\*\*

- Open burning/ fires are prohibited in the Conservation Zone (the mountain area near and including White Rock Acres).
- Cleaning and maintenance of driveway pipes is the responsibility of the homeowner.
- Please refrain from placing or planting items within the road right-of-way area. Items in the right-of-way area can affect sight distances, snow removal and other road work. The public works department reserves the right to trim or remove any items within the right-of-way.
- Pets should NOT be allowed to roam freely in any neighborhood or onto any neighbor's properties; or otherwise be allowed to disturb neighbors.
- Please report any downed roadway signs to the Township office.
- Dirt bikes & ATV's are not permitted on public roadways, including cul-de-sacs, in the township.
- Speed limits are established for the safety of all, please obey the posted speeds and stop signs in all areas of the township.
- The PA State Police provide police coverage to the township. The non-emergency number is 717-249-2121.

Burning Permit Note: Monroe Township may issue a Permit which gives a Monroe Property Owner the authorization to conduct an open burn on cut trees, stumps and brush. This permit does not allow the burning of such items as demolition waste, insulation, shingles, treated wood, paint, painted or stained objects or furniture, tires, mattresses, box springs, metal, insulating coating on wire, television sets and appliances, automobiles, automotive parts, batteries, PVC products, waste oil and other petroleum products.

The Monroe Fire Marshall should be contacted at 717-226-2628, if you have any questions as to allowable materials under the open burn permit.

This historic cemetery, located at the intersection of Boiling Springs Road and York Road, contains the graves of many Monroe families that date back to the late 1700's. Many of the township's Civil War veterans are buried here.

#### MAINTENANCE OF DRAINAGE SWALES

In order to prevent damage and flooding, almost every property in the Township has some type of drainage system to direct storm water away from our homes, farms, driveways, streets and other improvements. Each system contains individual elements to carry the storm water, which can consist of items such as sloping ground away from improvements, ditches or swales, drains, inlets or pipes. It is essential for these elements to be properly maintained in order for the system to function.

Questions frequently arise regarding whose responsibility it is to maintain these drainage facilities, particularly after large rainfall events. Generally, the Township is responsible for maintaining facilities located within the road right of way, and property owners are responsible for maintenance of facilities on private property. Often the actual boundaries of maintenance responsibility are not defined at a single point, as all facilities within a system need to be maintained in order to prevent damage. For example, a pipe under the road (Township's responsibility to maintain) may carry water and discharge it onto private property (Owner's responsibility to maintain), and both must be functioning. Any drainage facility can be overwhelmed during abnormal rainfall events.

Property owners should take steps to insure grass clippings, leaf litter and sticks and branches do not accumulate in the swales, ditches and on top of drainage inlets or catch basins. Over time, sediment will accumulate in swales and can reduce the amount of water they can carry. This sediment should be removed and any bare ground stabilized with grass or other vegetation or erosion control measures.

Property owners also must ensure they are not intentionally diverting water out of the roadside swales and into the road as it leads to the premature erosion of the roadway and the running water over the road can create a dangerous hydroplane situation or worse, ice. Owners should evaluate the ground level around their homes to insure there is adequate slope away from their foundation wall. These items are particularly important in steeper areas of the Township, such as White Rock Acres and other areas of South Mountain.

cerebral palsy, down syndrome, wheel chairs, and other challenges have thrived in the program.

Our goal is to enable players to develop their physical fitness, technical skills, courage, and self-esteem through the game of soccer.

TOPS sessions are held on Sunday afternoons at Creekview Park, Mechanicsburg, PA in the spring and fall. The TOPS program is open to any child, including children who live outside of the Cumberland Valley School District.

Every player receives a complete soccer uniform, and HMMS waives the late fee and the out-of-area fee for the TOPS program.

#### **Appalachian Trail Volunteer Opportunities**

The Appalachian National Scenic Trail is a continuous footpath extending more than 2100 miles between Springer Mountain in Georgia and Mount Katahdin in Maine. The Trail is maintained largely by volunteer labor organized in more than 30 maintaining clubs working with the Appalachian Trail Conservancy and the National Park Service. The Cumberland Valley Appalachian Trail Club (CVATC) is one of those clubs, responsible for maintaining 17 miles of the Trail across the Cumberland Valley. There are some beautiful, pastoral scenes from the Trail in Monroe Township.

CVATC is looking for active volunteers to help with trail maintenance and the organizational work of the club. 

#### **Medication Drop Boxes**

#### **Disposal Guidelines:**

- All pharmaceutical drugs that are being disposed of need to be in a sealed container such as the original bottle or a zip-lock bag. They may NOT be disposed of loosely
- Liquid Pharmaceuticals should remain in the original container
- Personal information should be removed or blotted out with a permanent marker
- Intravenous solutions, injectables, & needles are NOT accepted
